Part 1: A Bird's Eye View

In this segment of flight-themed camp, we will learn about avian evolution from a dinosaur ancestor, specific adaptations for bird flight, and the ways that flight in birds continues to evolve today. We will also study wing anatomy and physiology and develop tools to help us appreciate native birds. It will include nature walks, fun and engaging labs that will offer a hands-on opportunity to experiment with various bird designs, and also an opportunity to build your very own bird-feeding station.

Part 2: Humans in the Sky

In the second segment of flight-themed camp, we will examine the physics and engineering of mechanical flight from a historical and modern perspective spanning from the Wright brothers all the way through space exploration. Campers will build and test mini-rockets and airplane models while learning about factors that influence thrust, lift, stability, and drag. This camp is sure to be a blast! No previous knowledge is necessary.
